


Mother's Day Afternoon Tea


































Dance Groups

Anyone interested in dance classes can contact our school directly or the class teachers. We are always happy to welcome new students








Greek Independence Day

25th March

The Greek Revolution of 1821 was a big moment in Greek history when the Greek people fought to break free from the rule of the Ottoman Empire, which had controlled them for centuries.
